EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

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Election Season: The November 2, 2010 general election is guickly arriving and ACEC/MD has been actively involved in meeting with legislators to express our concerns about the future of infrastructure funding. We recently hosted a fund raiser for Congressman Dutch Ruppersberger at the Engineer's Club and supported several other elected officials in their election campaigns. Your contribution to the ACEC ACEC/PAC and ACEC/MD CEPAC has helped us support these candidates. In addition, it is important to show strong support in the upcoming Maryland legislative session, including attending ACEC/MD's Legislative Breakfast on December 1, 2010 at the Engineer's Club featuring Barry Rascovar and the Legislative

Luncheon on January 20, 2011 at the Governor Calvert House in Annapolis.

Local Transportation Funding Initiatives: The Governor has formed the "Blue Ribbon Commission on Maryland Transportation Funding" to look at the transportation funding issues and provide recommendations on how to fund "much needed" infrastructure improvements. The Commission's first two meetings included presentations from the Maryland Department of Transportation Modal Administrators and discussions on the economic impacts of transportation by various experts. The Commission has four more meetings in November and December, and will prepare an interim report of their findings which is expected to be complete by January, 2011.

ACEC/MD's Transportation Subcommittee has been closely tracking the progress of the Commission and will provide input if requested. We are updating the presentation "Transportation and You" and will forward it to the Blue Ribbon Commission. Also, due to the economic conditions, QBS will be given a greater emphasis, and the inappropriateness of taxing professional services will be addressed.

General Membership Meeting: On October 14, 2010, ACEC/MD held our fall general membership meeting at the Engineer's Club. Our guest speaker, Al Foxx, Director, City of Baltimore Department of Public Works, discussed his vision for the future of the Department of Public Works. His discussion included how he plans to continue and improve the partnership between the City and the consultant industry.

# **ACEC/MD Continues Efforts to Secure Transportation Funding**

While the tenor of the election season has focused on reduced government spending, ACEC/MD continues its efforts to keep transportation funding at the forefront.

Discussions with elected leaders and political insiders including Speaker Busch have revealed that there is understanding that something needs to be done. This provides renewed optimism that there could be a window of opportunity in the 2011 General Assembly session.

ACEC/MD's Transportation Funding Task Force, chaired by RK&K's Steve Zentz, initially developed a presentation for member firms to utilize in educating their employees. Accessible on ACEC/MD's website, at www.acecmd.org, this presentation is narrated by long-time radio personality Alan Walden. This resource provides an easy to understand description of the funding process for state transportation projects, while demystifying the political process to ensure involvement by our member firm employees. If you have not already utilized this resource, we encourage you to do so today.

The goal is to have the 6,000-strong ACEC/MD member firm employees become spokespeople, at community and business gatherings, and during their daily

interactions, for the critical need to enhance transportation funding.

ESB Offers New Membership Category for Associate Society Member Employees

The Engineers Club Board has approved an attractive new Membership Category for individuals employed by Associate Society Members. By creating this Associate Society Membership category, the Club hopes to encourage the 10,000 employees of the 27 Associate Societies of the Club to join and take advantage of the many member activities and privileges of membership in Maryland's preeminent professional club.

Under the new Associate Society Membership status the Club extends the opportunity for individuals that join the Engineers Club full rights and privileges enjoyed by current members. Associate Society Members:

- Are billed dues at a rate of \$80 monthly. (Fiscal year 2011)
- Are not required to meet quarterly minimums.
- Must maintain their membership in their associate society in good standing throughout the term of their Associate Society Membership.
- May have their initiation fee reduced/waived under the following terms:
 Join for an initial term of 2 years-50% current initiation fee.
 Join for an initial term of 3 years-Initiation fee waived.

ESB's Membership Committee has set a goal of increasing membership by 100 members, which would return Club membership to pre-recession levels. As an ACEC/MD member firm employee, be sure to take advantage of this valuable opportunity.

ACEC/MD Hosts Fundraiser For Congressman Ruppersberger

Through member firm employees and ACEC/PAC contributions, ACEC/MD was able to raise approximately \$11,000 for long-time ACEC/MD supporter Congressman Dutch Ruppersberger.

At the September 28th event, the Congressman and Legislative Director Ann Jacobs graciously took an hour and half out of their busy schedules to first meet with the Host Committee in a small group setting and then with other contributors to discuss issues of importance to our member firms.

At the event the Congressman was advised of the difficulties facing the industry due to the downturn in infrastructure funding and the uncertainty brought on by the inability to pass transportation, water and aviation legislation. The Congressman was very surprised to hear that the stimulus funds failed to have a positive impact on engineering firms providing transportation infrastructure services. Members reiterated a message that was delivered earlier in the year that due to open-end agreements, engineers could be put back to work in a short time frame providing plans for sustainable projects that would stimulate the entire construction industry.

Another request of the Congressman that was made during the meeting was the desire for him to again co-sponsor legislation that would repeal the 3% withholding tax. Without action, in 2012, the federal government and state governments along with all jurisdictions that have annual expenditures that exceed \$100-million in projects will be required to withhold 3% of fees from firms providing services. While the intent of the law is to crack down on tax violators, a recent DOD study estimates that it would cost DOD alone \$17-billion in the first five years to comply with this mandate.

In order to continue this valuable dialogue, Congressman Ruppersberger requested that his Legislative Director sit down with ACEC/MD representatives in the coming weeks to develop an action plan. We will keep you informed of the proceedings.

Transportation Task Force Gets Underway

At the kickoff meeting for the Blue Ribbon Commission on Maryland Transportation Funding, MDOT Secretary Beverley Swaim-Staley and representatives of each modal agency, and MDTA and WMATA provided a thorough briefing of the Transportation Trust Fund and its connection with their respective agencies. The mission of the Commission is to review, evaluate, and make recommendations concerning State transportation funding sources and the Maryland Transportation Trust Fund (TTF).

Echoing concerns expressed by ACEC/MD, AAA's representative on the Commission, Lon Anderson, brought up the issue of transfers from the Transportation Trust Fund to the General Fund. Secretary Swaim-Staley commented that most of the transfers have been repaid, but she committed to providing details to the Commission on past repayments.

The next meeting of the committee is scheduled for November 4th from 10:00am – 12:00pm in Annapolis. For details contact staff person Don Halligan at 410-865-1275 or <u>dhalligan@mdot.state.md.us</u>.

While the Commission lacks representation from some traditional organizations, chairman Gus Bauman is a veteran of the successful efforts to defend the ICC. Up to this point the deliberations have clearly focused on the connection between economic development and transportation. ACEC/MD is preparing to provide testimony to the Commission during subsequent meetings following the elections. Please see below for background information on the commissioners.

ACEC/MD Past President and RK&K Principal Burt Cox Passes Away

It is with great sadness that we report the passing of **Burton N. Cox, Jr., P.E.**

at the age of 84. The long-time Stoneleigh resident served as the President of the Consulting Engineers Council of Maryland in 1969-70. A veteran of the Korean War, Mr. Cox was a 1943 graduate of Polytechnic Institute and earned a Bachelor's degree in civil engineering in 1946 from Villanova University. Mr. Cox went to work for member firm Rummel, Klepper & Kahl (RK&K) in 1946 when the firm had eight employees. At the time of his retirement from the firm in 1986 as a Principal, RK&K had grown to 180 employees. During his distinguished career, Mr. Cox was responsible for the structural design of many buildings, bridges, and waste treatment facilities including Shriver Hall on the Johns Hopkins University's Homewood Campus, the Veteran Administration Hospital in Northeast Baltimore, the Cromwell and Catonsville water pumping stations, Polytechnic Institute-Western High School, and the master site plan for the University of Maryland, Baltimore County.
